We encourage regular attendance at school, and share the government target of 95% attendance for our students. You can see your child's current attendance record on Class Charts, and we will update you periodically. If your child's attendance falls below 90% they are classed as a persistent absentee and their attendance will be more closely monitored. Where possible we request that parents make doctors and dentist appointments outside of school hours. Leave of absence is also discouraged, and we do consult with the Local Authority in order to issue fixed penalty notices.

Regular school attendance is essential if children are to achieve well and Huntington School believes that regular school attendance is the key to enabling children to maximise the educational opportunities available to them and become emotionally resilient, confident and competent adults who are able to realise their potential and make a positive contribution to their community. EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

At Huntington, we feel that education is not just about what happens in the classroom, it is about providing all our students with as many opportunities as possible to engage with a broad range of extra-curricular activities. VISIBLE CONSISTENCIES AND INFRINGEMENTS

An important part of ensuring the highest standards of behaviour and keeping our young people safe are our Visible Consistencies:

VISIBLE CONSISTENCIES				
STANDARD 1	Students must have their top button and tie fastened correctly.	CONDUCT 1	Students must walk sensibly on the left side of the corridor and stairwells.	
STANDARD 2	Students must wear their school jumper* and must not wear hoods inside.	CONDUCT 2	Students must observe the one- way system at all times.	
STANDARD 3	Students must not wear coats in the classroom.	CONDUCT 3	Students must talk quietly as they travel through school. Shouting/swearing/raised voices is not permitted.	
STANDARD 4	Students do not wear jewellery with the exception of one pair of stud earrings.	CONDUCT 4	Students must line up quietly in single file outside of classrooms and when waiting in the lunch queues.	
STANDARD 5	Students must not be seen with a mobile phone or earphones in school.	CONDUCT 5	Play fighting and excessive physical play is not acceptable at any time.	

We expect all students in school to follow these rules and meet our expectations; we have been really impressed with the super start that they have made this academic year.

In addition, we worked with all students on their first day to understand the importance of organisation and arriving with the correct equipment for all lessons:

Succeeding at School: Be Prepared Equipment Make sure you bring the right equipment to school. You will need: Student planner Blue or black pen (and a spare) Pencil / Ruler 30 cm Eraser Pencil sharpener ✓ Calculator (as recommended by the Mathematics Department) Other useful equipment might be: Protractor Coloured pencils Pair of compasses ✔ Highlighter Set square English dictionary

To support students with this, form tutors are checking student uniform and equipment in tutor time. They are supporting students to correct any infringements or equipment issues at the start of the day. This means that we can expect all students to move around the school appropriately and safely and arrive at lessons with all of the equipment they need for the day.

If students do not adhere to any of the Visible Consistencies or arrive at a lesson without the correct equipment, they will receive an infringement which will be recorded on Class Charts. Students who receive four infringements in a week, will then receive a detention.

We thank parents for their support in ensuring students are wearing the correct uniform and have the equipment they need for school. If you are experiencing difficulty obtaining any equipment or uniform please contact the year group pastoral team.
